

## Photizo<sup>®</sup> Case study Degloving wound

**Patient:** 1 year old male Miniature Pincher dog

**History:** The patient was presented with a **large degloving wound** on the lower left front limb. **No skin** was present on the affected area and the dog was licking the open wound for the past 2 days.

**Treatment:** Phototherapy was done once a day for the first week and thereafter every second or third day. Bandages and topical wound dressings comprising of Intrasite gel were used. No other anti-inflammatory drugs or antibiotics were used during this trial.

**Outcome:** Initially phototherapy was used to create a good granulation tissue bed for skin grafts, but the **wound healed and contracted so well and at such a high speed, that a skin graft was never even needed. Epithelialisation** was much better than initially predicted and the dog made a full recovery with **all of the hair growing back with minimal scar tissue formation.**
